Recreational Trails Program

The FHWA Recreational Trails Program for Louisiana (RTPL) is a Federal-aid assistance program to help States provide and maintain recreational trails for both motorized and nonmotorized recreational trails use. The program provides funds for all kinds of recreational trail uses, such as pedestrian uses (hiking, running, wheelchair use), bicycling, in-line skating, equestrian use, off-road motorcycling, all-terrain vehicle riding, four-wheel driving, or using other off-road motorized vehicles.

RTPL is administered by the Louisiana Office of State Parks, Division of Outdoor Recreation. RTPL provides funding for recreational trails in both urban and rural areas throughout the state. The program may be used on any trail that provides recreation.

Project sponsors are evaluated and monitored to assure that the projects will be accomplished quickly, the required 20% match is provided, and projects are in compliance with the federal guidelines for the program.

What type of projects are permitted?

A grant recipient may use monies received under this Program on actual trail or trail-related projects such as:

- Construction of new trails on state, parish, municipal or private lands, where a recreational need for such construction is shown.
- Redesign, reconstruction, no routine maintenance, or relocation of trails in order to mitigate and minimize the impact to the natural environment.
- Structure design or engineering, or GPS mapping when included with trail development (not to exceed 5% of grant).
- Trail development and renovation activities such as: subgrade preparation, base course, soil sterilization, earthwork, erosion control, revegetation, natural and hardened surfacing, culverts, low-water crossings, bank improvements, retaining walls, guard rails, and hand rails.
- Bridges and boardwalks may be constructed, repaired, or replaced to provide an integral link along a trail, to provide connections between trails.
- Development of trailside and trailhead facilities. This includes trail components or associated facilities which serve the purpose and safe use of the recreational trail, and may include, but are not limited to, the following: drainage, crossings, stabilization, parking, signage, controls, shelters, hitching rails, bike racks, fencing, motorized access barriers, water, restroom facilities.
- Providing access and use of trails by persons with disabilities.
- Acquisition of easements for trails or for trail corridors identified in a trail plan.
- Acquisition of fee simple title to trail Right Of Way (ROW) property from a willing seller, when the objective of the acquisition cannot be accomplished by acquisition of an easement or by other means.

• Construction of new trails crossing federal lands, where such construction is approved by the administering agency of the State, and the Federal agency or agencies charged with management of all impacted lands. Such approval to be contingent upon compliance by the Federal agency with all applicable laws, including the National Environmental Policy Act and the Forest and Rangeland Renewable Resources Planning Act of 1974, and the Federal Land Policy and Management Act.

What type of projects are not permitted?

A grant recipient may not use monies received under this Program for:

- Planning or environmental documentation.
- Condemnation of any kind of interest in property.
- Construction of new trails for motorized use on National Forest land that has been recommended for Wilderness designation.
- Road construction, sidewalks, gardening/landscaping, park acquisition, sprinklers, or campgrounds.

What are the recommended project guidelines?

Projects selected for funding should:

- Follow guidelines of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) in providing for trail access and consider the needs of the elderly and families with small children.
- Further a trail-related goal in the Statewide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan (SCORP) or local/regional comprehensive plan.
- Include a commitment for maintenance and long-term public access.
- Have written permission and support of land manager(s).
- Include a commitment to starting and completing the project quickly and efficiently.
- Provide for trail use in a manner sensitive to the environment.
- Plan for the needs of the widest variety of trail users and accommodate them safely.
- Solicit Disadvantaged Businesses when contracting out work.
- Include resolution of support from local government

DETAILED PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Town of Abita Springs (Abita) is a bedroom community and a major tourist attraction. 52.8% of the area population are in underserved communities that access daily needs within Abita Springs. Abita is a walking and bicycling community with weekly arts & farmers markets, festivals year-round, trailhead & park. Abita is a major access point for the St. Tammany trace bike trail which connects 5 cities. Abita currently has very limited designated walking areas, lighting, and safety signals, and needs to expand its sidewalks to allow cyclists and pedestrians safe passage. Approximately 938 students attend the public elementary and middle schools within the town, many of which cross streets with no safety control devices. Additionally, many of the disadvantaged communities and vulnerable populations walk into town to access schools, and stores, for their economic needs. This project provides 9 areas of sidewalk expansion that currently do exist including crosswalks to tie-in to the existing transportation corridors within the town providing non-motorized transport safer and more convenient. This project will be in compliance with ADA requirements and provide a continuous transportation corridor linking the many activity centers in the town: businesses, schools, shopping areas, recreational areas, etc. The project will provide an expansion of 7421 feet of sidewalks with 445 feet of high visibility crosswalks, notated on the map. The funding sought enables Abita's capacity to expand its sidewalk facilities and will enhance current safety improvements being made throughout the community. Abita desires to continue working with Kyle Associates for engineering design and construction management of these improvements who has the current knowledge and experience working within Abita. The Town of Abita Springs has committed as its local match to hire and pay for these design and engineering costs.

The Sidewalk Expansion Project improves the quality of life, quality of transportation for Abita Springs residents and visitors, and provides a significant community benefit. The project will be a lasting sustainable project for the community and has long-term value. With Abita being a walking and bicycling community providing expanded sidewalks will mitigate bicyclists and pedestrians being in the roadways mitigating accidents and potential fatalities. These sidewalk facilities will not only link the many areas of commercial businesses but also museums, four schools, multiple churches, and three medical facilities. Adjacent to the northwest corner of Abita Springs is an area of over 50% LMI population. This population utilizes the transportation infrastructure to travel into Abita Springs to access economic resources. This west portion of the town and much of the surrounding area is identified by DOT as a highly disadvantaged community. This disadvantaged Census Tracts exceeded the 50th percentile (75th for resilience) across at least four of the six transportation disadvantaged indicators and these residents will be a benefiicary of this project.

IMPLEMENTATION

This Sidewalk Expansion Project is ready for funding and will begin upon notice of the award. The initial design has already been completed and this project's first activity will be the engineering and final design which is anticipated to take six (6) months to complete. Advertising and bids will be conducted through LaDOTD and after the award, construction duration would take about six (6) months if all sidewalks and crossing beacons are done under one contract. Abita Springs Public Works would oversee and manage the project and therefore there wouldn't be any anticipated "hold-ups'.







